## ABOUT THE PROGRAMS

THE SARAH LAWRENCE COLLEGE ART OF TEACHING PROGRAM is an integrated Master of Science in Education program of study with three New York State certification tracks: Early Childhood Education (birth to 2nd grade), Childhood Education (1st to 6th grade), and Dual Certification in Early Childhood and Childhood Education (birth to 6th grade). Working together in seminar classes, students receive individual attention from faculty as they connect their teaching experiences in schools with theoretical and practical ideas in education.

**THE MASTER OF ARTS IN CHILD DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM** offers students the opportunity to explore the life of the child as the interaction of intellectual, emotional, social, and imaginative streams. The program combines in-depth study of primary theoretical perspectives with practical fieldwork, and encourages students to study children in a wide range of social contexts and environments.

# The Early Childhood Center (ECC)

The Early Childhood Center (ECC) provides a thoughtful, progressive curriculum for children ages two through six in preschool and kindergarten. Its programs are modeled on the Sarah Lawrence pedagogy, and it provides a setting for observation and research for Sarah Lawrence College students interested in child development and teaching.

#### Child Development Institute Play's the Thing

The Child Development Institute's 2019 Play's The Thing program is a five-day program that explores developmental, clinical, and cultural aspects of play in children's lives. It brings together professionals and graduate students who work with children in diverse contexts: educators, social workers, child life specialists, parks and recreation workers, children's museum staff—anyone interested in learning and advocating for the importance of play.

# Community Adventure Play Experience (CAPE)

As schools are eliminating recess and children are spending more time inside and in front of television and computer screens, community adventure play experiences play an important role in bringing children back to the basics of play as a way for them to develop initiative, collaborate, and problem-solve using recycled materials in their own communities.
