### "I HAVE READ A FIERY GOSPEL": THE CIVIL WAR, JULIA WARD HOWE, AND THE POLITICAL WORK OF LITERATURE WITH LYDE SIZER

TITSWORTH LIVING ROOM

In this seminar we will look at the ways one Northern woman writer participated in the conversation about war aims in a crucial early moment in the U. S. Civil War (Feb., 1862), focusing in on the most famous of all of the Civil War songs, Julia Ward Howe's "Battle Hymn of the Republic." This will be a chance to polish or take up your analytic skills of years past, to consider the work that political art can do, and to think hard about what motivates people (in this case, men) to sacrifice what may well be their life for a cause. This will also be a pedagogical exercise. We will start with a brief overview, following with first small group work and then general conversation. We will end with a discussion of the pedagogy itself: what skills can the close study of a political piece of art build?

### FROM SPINACH TO SPECTACULAR: THE GOLDEN AGE OF DOCUMENTARIES WITH HEATHER WINTER

Documentaries used to be something that you were told to watch because, like spinach, they were "good for you". Over the past 75 years, docs have moved from being the spinach to the caviar of content. Take a brief walk down history lane, from the first "actualities" to cult "mockumentaries" and explore how and why, from the portrait to the social issue, documentaries have taken their seat at the grown up table and are giving audiences, artists, and the box office what they crave: satisfying stories from all corners of the earth that have the power to move people and change the world, one film at a time.
